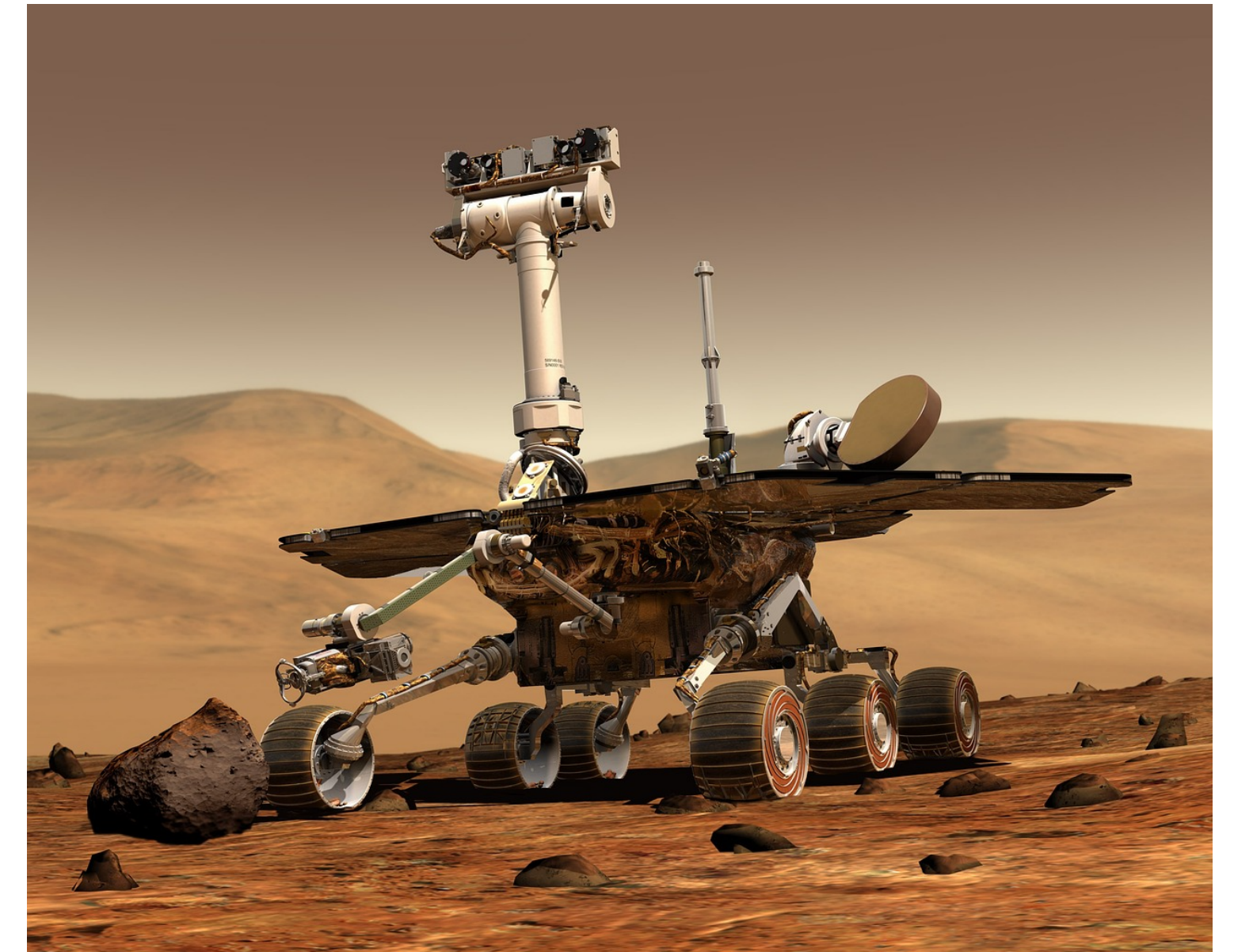

## **Topic: Verification of Multi-Objective Markov Models**

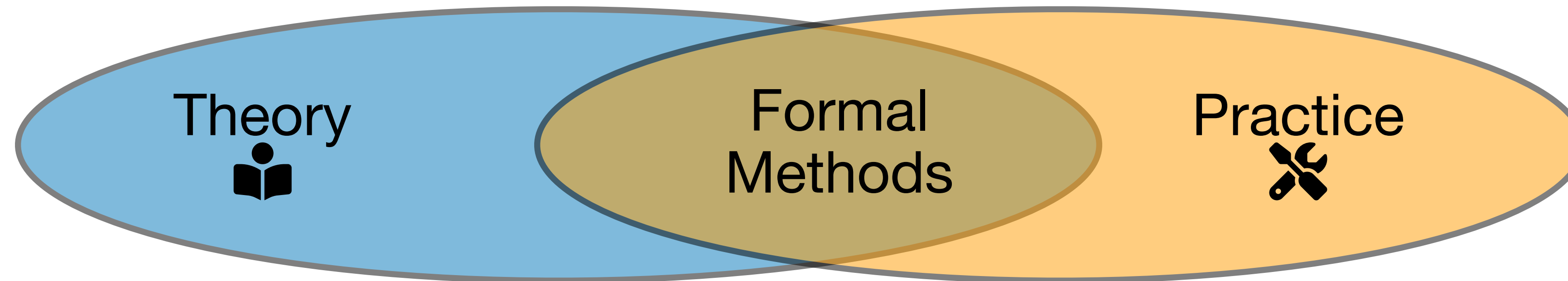
- Can an agent acting in an uncertain environment satisfy multiple performance criteria at once?
  - Example: safe, fast, and efficient Mars rover
  - Approach: formal methods / model checking
- 
- Passed with distinction
  - Nominated for Informatics Europe Best Dissertation Award





# The Beginning

- **Formal methods:** mathematically verify system correctness



- bachelor thesis in verification of probabilistic systems
- got the chance to write a paper based on thesis
- accepted and presented at FM'2015



# Support from supervisor and colleagues

- Learned a lot from all kinds of collaborators
  - Advisors
  - Colleagues / Co-authors
  - Students I supervise

# Networking

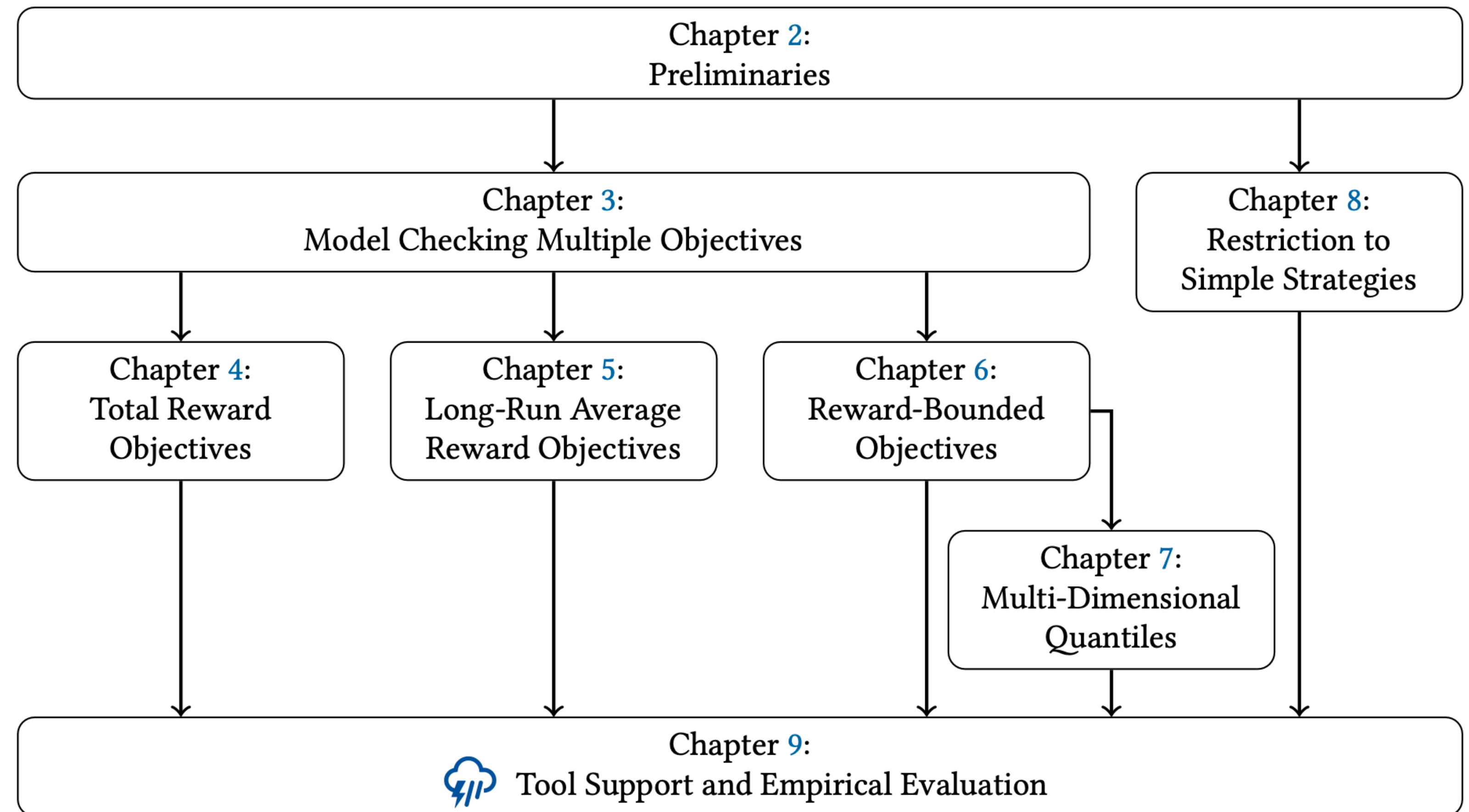
- Approximately one conference and one workshop per year
  - most fruitful<sub>(for me)</sub>: small, focussed workshops where people pitch **current ideas**

# Dissertation

- **Monograph:** coherent rewrite; not just a collection of papers
- **Goal:** Make it worth reading for everyone, not just the examiners
- Revisit / revise my own research
- No hard deadline or page restrictions

  - value their advice
- Writing a dissertation is an excellent chance to **revisit your own research**
