Topic: Verification of Multi-Objective Markov Models


- Can an agent acting in an uncertain environment satisfy multiple performance criteria at once?
- Example: safe, fast, and efficient Mars rover
- Approach: formal methods / model checking



- Passed with distinction
- Nominated for Informatics Europe Best Dissertation Award

The Beginning

• Formal methods: mathematically verify system correctness



- bachelor thesis in verification of probabilistic systems
- got the chance to write a paper based on thesis
- accepted and presented at FM'2015

- Working together as a team




Networking

- Approximately one conference and one workshop per year

Dissertation

- Monograph: coherent rewrite; not just a collection of papers
- Goal: Make it worth reading for everyone, not just the examiners
- Revisit / revise my own research
- No hard deadline or page restrictions
